Your Secretariat is a devoted and faithful team and is working extremely hard to build up the Cursillo Movement. We have drawn up a **Strategic Plan** for the next couple of years and earmarked **three areas of concentration**:

**1) Cursillo Weekends** – to keep the momentum and energy going by putting on a Weekend each year; to put on the best Weekends we can by being as well prepared as possible, remembering we have a responsibility to God, to the participants, to the Cursillo method and to ourselves, to be the best we can be! This is in keeping with our Bishop's mandate of "Excellence in Ministry."

**2) Ultreyas** – to revitalize both Diocesan and Regional Ultreyas, but particularly at this time, concentrating on our Diocesan Ultreyas which have dropped in attendance over the last few years. **Richard Turner, chair of the Post-Cursillo Committee** is to be commended for his organization of the recent Diocesan Ultreya held on January 18<sup>th</sup> at the Church of the Nativity. About 50 people attended, including a number of new Cursillistas, and there was a real spirit of camaraderie, with many positive and encouraging comments.

**3) Marketing and Publicity** – to work at raising the profile of Cursillo; to be more determined about using the Niagara Anglican as one vehicle to do this. Perhaps many of you will have seen the Cursillo article in the February issue of the Niagara Anglican – practically a full page about the November Weekend as seen through the eyes of one of the table communities. Thank you and gratitude to **Carol Summers** who along with her table community wrote the article.

Our **Spiritual Director, Susan Wells**, and the **Pre-Cursillo Committee headed by Dave Tinker**, will aim to increase the awareness of Cursillo amongst the clergy and non-cursillistas. To this end Dave's committee has been working hard at drawing up brochures and other printed material for distribution.

"The Rainbow", along with blast emails, will continue be the vehicles of information and communication. Ken Simmons has resigned as Editor and we extend our heartfelt thanks to him for all his work. We are very grateful to **Nancy Wood, our Communications Chair**, who volunteered to take on the job as Editor of "The Rainbow".

We have been partnered with Huron Diocese for several years, and have two representatives from Huron who sit on Secretariat, **Marion Bailey and Jessie Johnstone**. Marion and Jessie are working at increasing Cursillo's profile among the people of Huron, and their Bishop, Robert Bennett is very supportive of the movement.

As you can see, Secretariat members have some serious work to do, and are already surging ahead. They are dedicated, committed people and I am sure that together, with you the Wider Community, we can accomplish great things for our Lord. As we move forward with these plans, we ask your prayers for God's guidance!

The Cursillo prayer chain has been coordinated for many years by Doreen Langston. Several years ago Doreen asked us to seek someone else to take over from her. But, as with many things in the church, it was being done so well we put Doreen request on the back burner. Finally Doreen forced us to replace her by resigning. Doreen has given of her time and talent to coordinate this chain and has gone out of her way to get follow-up information on those we have been asked to pray for in order to keep the community informed and up to date. Thank you Doreen for your ministry, I know that being able to pray for each other’s needs has made the Cursillo community stronger. God hears us when we pray and always responds. You were the right person for this ministry.

Secretariat had been praying for someone to replace Doreen and at the last Diocesan Ultreya, God answered our prayer and Hilda Fair stepped forward offering to take on this ministry. Thank you Hilda, this is an important ministry for the Cursillo community.

The Cursillo Prayer Chain (what it is and how it works)

- When a request is received for prayer it is send out to the Cursillo community for prayer by e-mail.
- Because of the size of the Cursillo Community it has been suggested that requests for prayer be limited to Cursillistas and their families except under extraordinary circumstances.
- The community (those who receive the request) commit to pray for the situation on a regular basis for 2 weeks unless a shorter period is requested.
- People (situations) can remain on the prayer chain for longer than 2 weeks provided that an update is received on a regular (bi-weekly) basis.

## **The Rev Joyce Eleanor Phin (Moss) M. Div., WSHS**

It is with great sadness that we announce that Joyce Phin passed away on February 1, 2009. A joyfully celebration of Joyce's life was celebrated at St. Paul's Anglican Church on February 6. Joyce had a great deal to do with planning this celebration and ensuring that it expressed her love of her Saviour who had created and sustained her during her life and now has received her in her death.

Joyce was born May 3, 1933, in Toronto, the second of four children. Sisters Patricia and Gail live in Ontario, her brother Raymond is deceased. She is survived by her husband, John, to whom she was married 53 years. In fact, Joyce knew John for more than 70 years, meeting first as children through their extended families in the Cambridge area, and seeing each other during the summer months. Through their lives together, they are known to have supported each other in their professional, personal, and social activities. Joyce has well-loved sons, daughters in-law and grandchildren. John and Deborah and sons Matthew and Nicholas live in Calgary. Jay and Debra with daughter Megan and son Dayne are in Lethbridge. Jason and Gloria live in Toronto.

In 1987 Joyce was admitted as a "Sister" in the Worker Sisters and Brothers of the Holy Spirit. She was active in that community which guided her spiritual life and discipline. Joyce was also part of the first Palliative Care Team at Hamilton Health Sciences. Joyce served as Priest-Associate at St. Mary's Anglican Church, Bartonville and Grace Church, Waterdown. Later, she was appointed Rector, serving St. Paul's Church at Jarvis and Christ Church in Nanticoke

Joyce brought a sense of peace and rootedness to the Cursillo Community. It was her gentle spirit that helped guide the community during her time as Spiritual Director, as a member of Secretariat and as a member of numerous Cursillo Weekend Teams.

Joyce was never more excited than when John had his Weekend and they were able to share together in the gift of Cursillo and the community of friends they meet through Cursillo.

Joyce was always willing to listen and her guidance and insight were a blessing to many.

Joyce you are missed. Rest in peace.
